

Sunday, June 21, 2009: <u>John's Gospel: The Sixth Discourse – The Light of the World</u>

Scripture: John 8:12-59

Sermon Notes:

- 1. In this passage, Jesus faces more significant conflict with the Jewish rulers over His identity and authority.
- 2. Jesus is the light of the world which illumines all things.
- 3. John 8:15-18. There is an expectation that Jesus will prove His claims.
- 4. The law requires two witnesses to corroborate testimony because people tend to be liars (Deuteronomy 17:6).
- 5. John 8:16-18. I'm not alone in My testimony: I and My Father testify for My identity.
- 6. John 8:23. Jesus differentiates Himself from the world. This leads to agitation on the part of His accusers.
- 7. John 8:21. "You will die in your sins." This is a reference to Ezekiel 33:18.
- 8. If you do not believe the I AM, you will die in your sins, a reference to Exodus 3:14. Jesus is the I AM, who can be named and defined by no one.
- Jesus rejects the pluralism which is re-emergent in our day.
 Jesus says unless you believe that I AM you will die in your sins.
- 10. Evangelism and apologetics are forms of cultural violence if all great faiths are equally valid. But Scripture tells us evangelism is an act of mercy, life and love.
- 11. Jesus is the God of history. He creates, governs, and judges all things. If we reject this we are left with political correctness.

- 12. John 8:30-31. Those who believe are called to abide in the truth. Jesus offers them a spiritual freedom from sin, a sharing in the eternal life of God.
- 13. John 8:33. "We are Abraham's children." Today, like the Pharisees, anti-nomians may claim to believe in Abraham's God, but totally disregard His commandments.
- 14. John 8:42-47. Jesus reveals the character of the Pharisee's theory of knowledge. Their devil is a liar and the Father of lies.
- 15. The bondage of the human will is that we oppose the truth if it conflicts with our rebellious spirit.
- 16. 1 John 3:8. Christ is revealed to destroy the work of the devil, which is the blinding of man's hearts and minds. Blindness is removed by the work of the Holy Spirit.
- 17. John 8:51. If you keep My word you will never taste death. Death was bitter in paganism. But in Scripture death is sweet. Jesus tasted death for every man.

Application Questions:

- 1. How is the World's thinking characterized in 1 Cor. 1:19-25?
- 2. Why is it that the one type of god that's unacceptable to a pluralistic culture is the God of Scripture?
- 3. Why are we responsible to say some hard things to be free from the blood of our audience?
- 4. Why does turning away from Christ lead to meaninglessness, darkness, absurdity?
