Sermon Notes:

- 1. Hebrews 12. Jesus endured the cross for the joy set before Him.
- 2. The most mature Christians have often suffered greatly and yet experience great joy.
- 3. Matthew 10:16-25. Be wise as serpents, innocent as doves.
- 4. Jesus' desire is that the disciples will not fall away from the faith, becoming detached from the reality of Christ.
- 5. John 16:3. 'All these things they do because they have not known the father or Me.'
- 6. The Comforter helps us and guides us in our persecution.
- 7. The bodily absence of Christ calls for a new dependence on the Holy Spirit.
- 8. Rejoice in your sufferings. Romans 5:1-5; 1 Peter 1:1-9.
- 9. Persecution cements the truth together with the power of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church.
- 10. Galatians 1:13-15. Paul was zealous for the traditions but persecuted the church.
- 11. Some who persecute the Church think they are doing God a service.
- 12. We are promised divine power to carry out our mission.
- 13. Acts 1:8. The word 'witness' means "martyr".

Application Questions:

- 1. As Christ's servants what can we expect? See John 15:20.
- 2. According to Matthew 10:16-25, what is the attitude we ought to have in persecution, and what source of strength should we rely on?
- 3. How can we rejoice in suffering as we face trouble for being a Christian at work, or threats and opposition from unbelievers?
- 4. What does Revelation 2:8-11 teach about persecution?
- 5. In Revelation 2 and 3, we read about the Church facing persecution. What are the rewards for those who overcome?
