## **Sermon Notes:**

1. The challenge in this passage is to grasp the connection between a person's actions and heart.

- 2. Though He condemns judgmentalism, Jesus says we'll know false prophets by their fruit. Matthew 7:1-6, 15-20.
- 3. Jesus said to judge rightly, not by appearances. John 7:24.
- 4. Faith should bind us to Christ, not to what the church teaches.
- 5. We're saved by Christ, not by our ability to understand or articulate the doctrine of justification by faith alone.
- 6. James says it is ridiculous to claim faith in contradiction to one's actions and lifestyle.
- 7. Warm words alone do not satisfy people's needs; Christian love must include practical action to help those in need.
- 8. James rejects both faith without works and works without faith.
- 9. Hold fast bravely to Christ after receiving His gift of faith. Calvin
- 10. Christ does good things in us; we deny that we're in Christ if we don't do His good works.
- 11. We're to act out the salvation that God has begun in us. Philippians 2:12-13.
- James combats people whose faith is so superficial that it has no affect on their lives.
- 13. In teaching justification by faith alone, Paul combats legalists who are trusting in their works as a basis of salvation.
- 14. In keeping with James, both Paul and John teach the necessity of works to accompany true faith: Galatians 5:6; Ephesians 2:8-10; 1 John 3:16-18.
- 15. God chooses to work through us as we pray and obey His will.
- 16. Real faith is never alone, as demonstrated by Abraham whose faith was active with his works. Verse 22.
- 17. Justifying faith is active in producing good works.

- 18. Jesus learned obedience by His many years of submission.
- 19. As an outworking of our faith, acts of obedience are important ways that God shapes and prepares us for His kingdom service.
- 20. The only sign of past conversion is present convertedness.

## **Application Questions:**

- 1. How does John 15:1-8 contribute to our understanding of the place of good works in the Christian life?
- 2. What does Jesus teach on judging others and their fruit?
- 3. Show how Paul and John reinforce James' teaching on faith and works.
- 4. Why must we still pray for things that are within our control?
- 5. How is the faith of demons accurate? How is it deficient? See James 2:19.
- 6. According to Philippians 2:12-13 what is the source of the Christian's good works?
- 7. Why were Abraham and Rahab counted righteous?
- 8. Do my actions show that Christ has done a good work in my life?
- 9. Are my practical acts of Christian love consistent with my claims of faith?
